For school board:

- State representatives have been working to expand school vouchers. Are you in support or against these programs? Why or why not?

A. Parental rights and responsibilities come first. Not all children have parental oversight or control. All curriculum and materials should be available for parents. Systems and individuals varying from the curriculum should be accountable.
