

Vivian Fulk TCB candidate questionnaire

Vivian Fulk, age 65, is a retired Industrial Engineer (NCA&T) and IT Project Management Specialist (BS Computer Information Systems High Point University). I served as Stokes Democrats Party Chair, also with the Honorable VP Al Gore's Climate Reality Project as a mentor and presenter and as a business vineyard co-owner (Medley Meadows Musical Farm, King, NC) and founder and pioneer into the Yadkin Valley winegrape region as an Old North State Wine-grape Grower USDA Cooperative board member. My top priority if elected is to fully fund public schools per the Leandro Case and NC Constitution.
